The BlueBonnet BrewOff is the largest single site homebrew competition in the World. They've had to limit the number of entries to 1500 per event. A couple of years ago they exceeded 2000 entries and that proved to be too much for the competition. If you think about that there are a total of 44 categories with 20-30 beers per category, and in 🐧 some almost 60.

The beers are judged in two rounds, with the last round concluding the evening of March 21st. For those of you who have gone down to the BlueBonnet, you know that they are almost begging for judges. And if you have judged, you know that even in the last round there are usually about a dozen beers to judge so palete fatigue sets in pretty quickly.

#### **Local Beer News**

#### CHOC Brewery Upgrades to a 50 Barrel System

Well this old Trail Boss's wife works with the niece of the owners of Pete's Place in Krebs, Oklahoma, which happens to be the home of CHOC brewery. The niece, Emily Stangl, is also a part owner of one of Krebs premier restaurants, Roseann's. So she offered to take the teachers on a brewery tour and for a fine meal at the restaurant.

Well when this old Trail Boss heard about this I just had to go along. First off, this old Trail Boss didn't realize how far Krebs is from Norman, a little over a 2 hour drive. However I do have to admit it was worth it. We were met by Brewmaster Michael Lalli. They had just opened up the new tasting room so all the taps weren't quite in but they had about 6 CHOC's on tap. They also had about half a dozen Prairie Artisan Ales. It turns out that CHOC is a contract brewery for Prairie Artisan Ales. At the time they had over 12 different CHOC beers available for sale.

The new tasting room faces into the Brewhouse. and when we arrived, they were just finishing up a batch of beer. Right now they are working with a 15 barrel system. So while this old Trail Boss enjoyed a really nice Belgian Style OPA I watched as the brewers shoveled the grain out of the Mash tun. If you have never had to do this you don't realize immediately how labor intensive this is. For a batch this size they are probably starting with close to 1000 lbs of grain, and that is dry weight. Even though there is a door in the side of the mash tun to get the grain out, they still had to have one person in the mash tun with a shovel pushing the grain out and another collecting it. They filled up about 10 55 gal trash barrels of used grains. Michael tells me that local ranchers come and get the grain to feed to their livestock.

To house the 50 barrel system they had to have a new building built out back, which is impacting parking. Michael took us through the new building. The Mash tun, Brew Kettle and some fermenters were in there. To get some of the equipment here they had to have it cut in half and then welded back together once it arrived here.

Michael says that it has been a real undertaking but it is finally starting to come together and he was expecting to be brewing on the new system by early April.

So best of luck to Michael Lalli and CHOC, and hopefully we will be drinking beers from the new system in the near future.

#### World Beer Cup Awards Presented April 11th, 2014

(Denver, CO) – The Brewers Assocation handed out awards for the 2014 World Beer Cup held in Denver, Colorado, on Friday night April 11, 2014 at the Hyatt Regency in Denver, Colorado, USA.

One of the most prestigious competitions in the United States just concluded. Over 70% of the entries were submitted by US brewers.


